

Cookies Policy

It's a Penalty ("we", "our", "us"), and certain third parties, use cookies ("Tracking Technologies") to collect personal data and to store information or gain access to information stored on your device, when you use our website (at https://itsapenalty.org/) (our "Website"). This policy tells you more about Tracking Technologies and how we use them in our Website.

If you do not accept the use of these Tracking Technologies, please disable them by following the instructions in this policy below or by changing your browser settings so that Tracking Technologies from our Website cannot be placed on your computer or device.

We may change this policy from time to time. If we make any material changes to the way we handle your personal data in relation to Tracking Technologies, we will let you know by posting an updated version of this policy on our Website.

1. What are Tracking Technologies?

When you visit or access our Website, we use (and authorise third parties to use) cookies and plugins.

Cookies. Cookies are small text files, stored on your browser, that uniquely identify your browser or device. Cookies improve your user experience, for example, by enabling our Website to: (i) recognise new and repeat visitors, (ii) remember your preferences, (iii) measure Website traffic on a country-by-country basis, and (iv) work in an efficient way. You can find more information about cookies at www.allaboutcookies.org.

Tracking Technologies can remain on your device for different periods of time. Some Tracking Technologies exist only while your browser is open. These are deleted automatically once you close your browser. Other Tracking Technologies are "permanent", meaning that they survive after your browser is closed. They can be used by us to recognise your device when you open your browser and browse the internet again.

2. How do we use Tracking Technologies?

We use third party Tracking Technologies. Third party Tracking Technologies are set by a third party (such as analytics providers and business partners).

We use Tracking Technologies that perform the following functions:

- Essential Tracking Technologies, which are essential to the functioning of our Website, to
 provide a service requested by you or to comply with the law (e.g. the security requirements of
 data protection law). We do not need to obtain your consent in order to use these Tracking
 Technologies and these Tracking Technologies cannot be turned off as we cannot provide our
 Website without them.
- **Functionality Tracking Technologies**, which allow us to remember choices you make and provide enhanced and personalised features, e.g. to show you when you are logged in.
- **Performance Tracking Technologies**, which enable us to collect information about your online activity (e.g. the duration of your use of our Website), including behavioural data and content engagement. They allow us to provide you with a better user experience and to maintain, operate and continually improve our Website.

Social Media Tracking Technologies, our website includes social media features, such as Facebook "Share" buttons. These features are either hosted by a third party or hosted directly on our Website (in which case you can manage them as explained below) and enable us or the social network to obtain information about how you interact with our Website or the social network. In addition, where we have a presence on social media platforms, those platforms will set Tracking Technologies on your device when you visit our pages on their platforms so that we can obtain statistical information about how you interact with our social media presence. The cookies policy of the social media platform should explain how you can manage the Tracking Technologies that they set or you may also be able to manage these Tracking Technologies through using your browser settings, as explained below.

The table below sets out the types of Tracking Technologies our partners use in connection with our Website, and the purposes for which they are used.

3. Changing your settings

We use Tracking Technologies when providing our Website to make sure you can use and enjoy our Website easily. Some of these Tracking Technologies are essential and we can't provide our Website without them, but there are others that can be turned off. You have the right to choose whether or not to accept these optional Tracking Technologies. However, please note that if you choose to refuse Tracking Technologies you may not be able to use the full functionality of our Website.

Most browsers allow you to change your settings so that you can:

- See what Tracking Technologies are used on your device and delete all non-essential Tracking Technologies on a collective basis
- Block third party Tracking Technologies
- Block Tracking Technologies from particular websites
- Block all Tracking Technologies from being set
- Delete all Tracking Technologies when you close your browser (although deleting cookies means that any preference settings you have made on our Website may be lost)
